Admissions are contingent upon available space, philosophy, and the willingness of the family to abide by school guidelines.

Admissions

Thank you for your interest in Conquerors Christian Academy. We are excited that you and your family are interested in being a part of our school community. Conquerors Christian Academy accepts students beginning at age 4, provided they are fully potty trained and independent in restroom use.

The steps for enrollment are as follows:

Step One

Review the Website and Handbook. <https://conquerorschristianacademy.com>. We ask that you review the website and read the student/parent handbook. These two resources will give you important information on our school policy, procedures, and expectations for students and parents. After doing this we encourage you to follow up with a phone call if there are further questions in order to gain a full understanding of CONQUERORS CHRISTIAN ACADEMY.

Step Two

Complete Application. The application is available online at <https://conquerorschristianacademy.com>. Please note there is a non-refundable application fee for each application submitted. The application can be submitted through the webpage on the “enrollment” tab with the application fee.

Step Three

After you have applied and paid the fee, you will receive a call to schedule an evaluation of your child to determine their present academic level and a parent interview. We are excited to meet you and your family and learn what your child's educational and functional goals and needs are. During this step we can answer any questions that parents may have and determine if we are the right fit for you.

Step Four

Acceptance or Waitlist Notification. After a review, each family will receive an acceptance, denial, or waitlist letter. Information on school schedules and calendars will be sent at this time. If accepted, the registration fee will be due within one week of notification, or the student's spot will no longer be held.

Mid-Year Enrollment

Student applicants who wish to enroll mid-year or after the first day of school will be subject to a week trial period. During the trial period, records will be requested from previous schools, and the student will be evaluated for behavior and academic level. Tuition rates and fees will be applied starting the first day of attendance but will not be owed until the student is accepted and the trial period has ended.

Financial Responsibilities

Conquerors Christian Academy offers a 10-month payment option for tuition. The payments will be due on the first Monday of each Month beginning in August and ending in May.

A monthly payment that is not received by the 5th school day after tuition is due is considered late. A late fee of \$50 will be applied to any account that is late. Any account that is more than one month overdue will no longer be in good standing. Conquerors Christian Academy may reserve the right to un-enroll or hold records of any student who is not in good standing.

Payments may be made by check (payable to Conquerors Christian Academy) or cash. Auto-draft is available for monthly payments.

Refund Policy

Our staff is on yearly contracts that allow us to accommodate a small student to teacher ratio. Because we are a small school with a small working budget, refunds will not be issued. Upon registration a spot is reserved for your student, and you will be expected to pay all of your student's tuition and fees for the full year of registration. Your family will be financially responsible for your student's yearly tuition regardless of their attendance.

You may apply for an unenrollment exception to cease further financial obligation in the case of loss of primary income or the death of primary guardian.

Schedule of Fees

- Application fee: \$100
- Initial registration fee: \$250 Due within 1 week of approval letter being received to hold student's spot
- Book/supply fee (grades K-12): \$450 Due 30 days before school starts to ensure curriculum and supplies are ready for student day 1
- Late payment fee: \$50
- Return check fee: \$50
- Returning student re-enrollment fee: \$50
- Late pick up fee: \$5 per 5 mins *see School Hours / Drop Off & Pick Up for more information*

Available Discounts

- A 5% tuition discount is applied to each additional sibling enrolled after the full tuition of the first child.
- Families who pay their full annual tuition by August 1 receive a 5% discount on that child's tuition for the school year.

General

Lunch Policy

CONQUERORS CHRISTIAN ACADEMY believes that proper nutrition is vital to a child's development and ability to focus and learn. Each student will be required to bring their own lunch each day that does not need to be refrigerated or heated. We request that a balanced lunch is brought containing no more than one sugary item, and the students will be instructed to eat their main food items first. Students will also need to bring their own snack. Learning to cook and how to be functional in the kitchen is one of the most important skills we can acquire to gain independence. We will be spending time in the kitchen to learn basic cooking skills. There will be days when the students will be creating/eating their own lunches. Parents will be notified of these days in advance in order to not pack a lunch. It is very important that your child's allergies are on file so that we can accommodate for them in the meals we choose. Lunches are closed to outsiders as there will be teaching of social skills and manners throughout unless otherwise notified by staff.

Folders

Each student will be given a "take home" folder. This folder will be sent home weekly. This folder will contain monthly calendars, announcements, and schoolwork completed during the week. This folder will need to be returned to school the following school day. Lost folders will result in a \$10 fee for replacement.

Electronic Devices

The use of any personal electronic devices/phones during school hours is not allowed. If a student is using a personal electronic device during school, it will be confiscated and kept in the front office area. A fee of \$20 must be paid before the device or phone will be returned.

Grading System

CONQUERORS CHRISTIAN ACADEMY curriculum will not follow a traditional grading system. Scale grading and letter grading will not be used. The curriculum will have periodic assessments to ensure students have a thorough understanding of the material. This system is designed to promote conceptual understanding without a student feeling unneeded pressure to perform at a certain level or the pressure for teachers to exclusively teach to a test. In addition, written assessments from teachers will be sent home 2 times a year to keep parents up to date on how each student is progressing. At CONQUERORS CHRISTIAN ACADEMY will celebrate strengths and growth in ALL areas not just academics.

School Hours / Drop Off & Pick Up

The school day will begin at 8:00 AM and end at 2:00 PM. The school building will open at 7:45 AM for student drop off, and students will need to be picked up by 2:00PM. Late fees will be assessed for picking students up late. Beginning at 2:15pm, a charged of \$5 for every 5 minutes will be added to each student's account.

Each student will be issued a "pick-up" card at the beginning of the school year. This card must be presented for each student to be released for pick-up. Adults picking up students without this card will be required to present a valid ID and must be authorized for pick-up on the student's enrollment forms. Any changes to the student's pick-up forms must be in writing and submitted to the school's office or submitted by email.

School Closures

It may be necessary to close the school due to special elections, several weather conditions or to do deep cleaning to prevent the spread of disease. In the case of delays, early release, alternate location days or closures, parents will be notified as soon as possible through email, and social media.

Student Conduct

We at CONQUERORS CHRISTIAN ACADEMY take great pride in creating a place where children can learn not only academics, but also learn how to work well with others and be a part of a local community. We expect our students to have positive attitudes, encourage one another, and respect those around them. A child's attitude and readiness to learn begins at home and is reflected at school. We ask that our student's parents start their days off right with a healthy breakfast and timely arrival to school.

Dress code

The CONQUERORS CHRISTIAN ACADEMY learning process is deeply rooted in hands-on learning and creative, outside play. Our students will frequently spend a portion of the day outside. Because of this, we do ask that your child comes dressed appropriately for the day's weather. Students will go outside to play when warm, cold, and wet.

The following is a list of our dress code requirements. CONQUERORS CHRISTIAN ACADEMY students are required to wear the following to school unless otherwise noted for holidays or special occasions which will be announced:

Clothing

- Collared shirts or dresses of a solid color (no prints or stripes except CCA logo). Any color is acceptable. Brand logos must be no bigger than 2".
- Pants, shorts, and skirts also must be solid color with no distressing.
- If ladies wear leggings, shirts must be long enough to cover the student's bottom.
- Shorts without pockets (legging shorts/bicycle shorts) are not allowed.
- Shorts and skirts must be of finger-tip length.
- A CONQUERORS CHRISTIAN ACADEMY logo shirt or sweatshirt is allowable on Fridays as a replacement for the collared shirt.
- Clothing cannot be distracting to other students or disrupt learning.

Jackets/Hats/Hoodies

- All hoodies, sweatshirts, sweaters that are meant to be worn inside the building must also be solid with no pictures, words, or large logos.
- Jackets and coats intended for outside use do not have to follow the solid color requirements, but should be removed in the classroom. Words and graphics on outerwear are subject to approval from administration at any time.
- Hats and hoodies will need to be removed in the classroom.

Shoes

- Closed toe shoes are required daily, as we play outside daily.
- *A pair of rainboots will be supplied to stay at the school for your student's use during wet weather.*

Hair and face

- Hair must be of a natural color.
- Boys are not allowed to have facial hair of any kind.
- Make-up worn by girls should be at a minimum, using only lip gloss and mascara.
- Piercings are only allowed in ears.

Implementing a strong dress code is to align our outward appearance with our internal goals for our school and students. It is the intention of CONQUERORS CHRISTIAN ACADEMY to grow students who are more concerned with who they are in Christ, than they are with what they are wearing.

Administration has the right to send home notifications of dress code violations, as well as require students to be picked up if a student is out of dress repeatedly.

Discipline

*For the Spirit God gave us does not make us timid, but gives us power,
love and self-discipline.*

2 Timothy 1:7

CONQUERORS CHRISTIAN ACADEMY believes that the purpose of discipline is to guide a child's behavior and attitude in order to cultivate valuable qualities in children including respect, responsibility, honesty, and integrity. These qualities produce adults of a solid character who are valued members of their community. CONQUERORS CHRISTIAN ACADEMY also believes that the discipline should primarily be the responsibility of the parent in the home. While in the school, students will be given a clear expectation of the rules and procedure of the classroom and will be expected to follow them with best efforts. Disobedience of rules will result in age-appropriate disciplinary actions including, but not limited to, one of the following:

- Redirection
- Verbal reprimand
- Loss of privilege
- Call home
- Sent home for the day
- Suspension
- Expulsion

-Please note, if behavior continues and parents cannot be contacted the student will be separated from their peers and activities until parents or contacts arrive.

We understand that our students will process, think and regulate differently than more "typical" students. Just as we will look at the whole child when it comes to learning, we will also look at the whole child when it comes to discipline. We will work to find the root of the behavior and teach the student how to respond in a more appropriate manner. This will look different for each student depending on their age, diagnosis and cognitive level and all will be considered in the disciplinary process. Sensory regulation, executive functioning skills training will assist in helping a student learn how to make more appropriate choices when frustrated. It will be when we see clearly repetitive/defiant behaviors that further disciplinary action will be taken. We will be in communication with our parents when regular patterns or behaviors are noticed in hopes that we can be on the same page with remediation of the behaviors. When expectations at home and school are similar, we see greater progress.

Parents will be notified of disciplinary measures when beyond loss of privilege are administered.

Disciplinary actions are fully at the discretion of administration and are on a case-by-case basis.

General school rules and regulations include but are not limited to:

- Maintaining a positive attitude for the learning experience
- Respecting authority figures in the school including all peers, teachers and administrators
- Refraining from inappropriate behavior and language

- Refraining from Injuring or potentially injuring another child or teacher (physically or emotionally)
- No destruction of property
- No disrupting of the learning environment

CONQUERORS CHRISTIAN ACADEMY also prohibits the use of personal electronic devices at school, leaving the school building or grounds without permission, using school equipment (dry erase boards, craft supplies, computers, etc.) incorrectly or without permission, littering, not following dress code, name calling, cheating, lying, fighting, biting, stealing, harassment, use of unauthorized medication, use or possession of illegal substances, and possession of weapons.

We expect the same high standard of conduct to be upheld by parents of students. Parental behavior that does not align with the proceeding rules and regulations may also result in the expulsion of students.

Outside service provider expectations

Our first priority at CONQUERORS CHRISTIAN ACADEMY is learning. Learning takes place when children are allowed to explore and perform tasks, sometimes failing. This is how we grow and skills are built. We welcome outside service providers at our school yet ultimately the teaching and discipline should come from the teachers and admin. We want to avoid confusion from students who don't have outside service providers and want to have consistent expectations for all students.

Expectation's for outside services/providers ie: RBT's, private duty nurses, therapists etc. are as follows:

- During the school day outside service providers may watch as academics are implemented allowing teacher/admin to perform assistance or redirection IF needed. Again, learning is our main focus, if a student requires more specific correction/medical attention the outside service provider will be asked to step in so that learning can continue for the rest of the students.
- Lunches will be students, teachers, admin only, unless a medical need applies. Although lunch is a break from the day, during this time we will be working on social skills, manners, independence in feeding skills, consideration for others and clean up. Outside services may have a break at this time, unless medically necessary. *Note: We will have special lunch days announced where parents will be welcomed.*
- Meetings will be held at the beginning of the year and when needed to go over expectations so that outside service providers, teachers and admin are on the same page. We will also request consistent communication in relation to these expectations in order to work and grow together to give the students what they need to be successful.

Attendance/Make-up Work

Monday through Thursday are academic days and attendance is required. Maximum time in the classroom is necessary for each student to master the subjects taught. Because of the nature of the curriculum, CONQUERORS CHRISTIAN ACADEMY may require students who miss academic days to complete the missing material at home and turn in the missing assignments before the student's next academic review.

Fridays are CONQUERORS CHRISTIAN ACADEMY non-academic days! On Fridays, students will participate in special classes, extra-curricular demonstrations from members of the community. These days will not count toward attendance and will not need to be made up.

Homework is not generally assigned unless the student has missed school time due to excessive absences or the student has chosen to not fully participate in the day's activities.

Medical

CONQUERORS CHRISTIAN ACADEMY teachers and administration will attend to minor bumps and bruises and inform parents at the end of any incidences. The full staff is trained to perform first aid treatment to stop bleeding, prevent shock, and restore breathing. In the case of serious injuries, parents will be notified, and the child will be cared for until parents arrive. If deemed necessary by administration, an ambulance will be called at the expense of parents.

Illness

Students are not allowed to come to school if they have had any of the following symptoms in the last 24 hours:

- Fever over 100° F
- Vomiting
- Diarrhea
- Rash
- Any contagious conditions (pink eye)

If your student presents with any of these symptoms while at school, they will be sent home until 24 hours have passed with no symptoms. If by chance the parents cannot be contacted in a reasonable amount of time emergency contacts will be utilized. PARENTS please call and notify admin if the student will be absent from school.

Medications

Students are not allowed to bring medications to school. If your student is required to take medication at school, parents are responsible for bringing, administering, and taking medications home. CONQUERORS CHRISTIAN ACADEMY staff may not administer medications to student with the exception of inhalers, anti-seizure, anaphylactic reaction or other common life-saving medications in the case of emergencies. All emergency medications must be provided by the parent, clearly labeled, and accompanied by a current physician's action plan.

Allergies

Parents are required to list all student allergies to foods on the student medical form. Any changes to a student's allergy list must be updated immediately for the safety of the student.

Immunizations

Students must show proof of vaccinations in accordance with the requirements of the State of Texas. Shot records must be on file with the school before the student is allowed to attend class.

Students who are not immunized must present a state exemption to go on file. Exemptions for reasons of conscience are valid for two years.

Potty Accidents

Students attending must be potty trained at the beginning of the year to attend CONQUERORS CHRISTIAN ACADEMY. However, accidents do happen. All students need to provide a change of clothing in their backpacks in case it is needed.

Parent Involvement

Parental involvement is strongly encouraged at CONQUERORS CHRISTIAN ACADEMY. There will be opportunities to volunteer in the school and participate in your child's education. Some days that will need parent volunteers include:

- Water Day
- Thanksgiving Lunch
- Christmas program
- Special Olympics

Additional volunteer days may be available throughout the year.

Volunteers

Those wishing to be teaching/Friday event volunteers must fill out a volunteer application and will need to provide a background check to be on file in the office.

Classroom Visitation

Parents may visit their child's classroom and observe one day per semester. To minimize classroom disruption, visitation may last for one hour and must be scheduled with administration in advance. No other children, such as siblings, will be allowed to attend during classroom visitations.

Parent/Staff Communication

Most communication between director/teachers and parents will be through direct text. Some information will be sent in your student's folders, and we ask that you review all flyers that are sent home.

Teachers and Administration are very busy during pick up/drop off, so we request meetings be arranged in advance.

Before the start of school, CONQUERORS CHRISTIAN ACADEMY will have a "Meet the Teacher" night where you can meet the school staff and tour the building.

Once per year, CONQUERORS CHRISTIAN ACADEMY may send home a survey to parents with questions and options for comments regarding CONQUERORS CHRISTIAN ACADEMY policy and procedure to help improve upon the school programs. Teachers will be contacting parents once per semester to check in and report on your student's progress.

Student Safety

The safety of students, teachers, and administration is of the highest importance at CONQUERORS CHRISTIAN ACADEMY. CONQUERORS CHRISTIAN ACADEMY requires all staff members and volunteers to submit a background check run through the State of Texas.

Closed Campus

CONQUERORS CHRISTIAN ACADEMY is a closed campus. The only individuals allowed on campus are CONQUERORS CHRISTIAN ACADEMY staff, registered volunteers, and approved visitors. Doors remain closed and locked outside of pick up/drop off times. All visitors are required to check in with school director. Students are to remain on campus and under staff supervision at all times. Students must be checked out/in with director if they are to leave campus during school hours. Students will only be released to parents or parent approved emergency contacts.

Training

Administrators and teachers go through extensive training prior to the school year in order to ensure the safety of our students. This training includes CPR, first aid, active shooter, fire, tornado, and recognizing the signs/symptoms of abuse, Executive Functioning, Sensory and Autism trainings.

There will be a safety day at the beginning of each semester to instruct the students on safety procedures. On this day, students will be taught these procedures through a series of drills including fire drills, tornado drills, and active shooter drills.
